Day One of this event focused on the northern part of the Eastern Plains and included: a water presentation on the Lower South Platte River by Jim Yahn, a tour of the Colorado Lamb Processors' Facility in Brush, a visit to Magnum Feedyard in Wiggins, a tour of Kraft's Quail Ridge Dairy in Fort Morgan, a tour at Western Sugar Co-Op in Fort Morgan, and a dinner and wheat production talk at Beedy's Farm and Ranch in Genoa.
